2020 Annual Meeting UPDATE

W ith due regard to the safety and health of our employees, members, and the community, Jones-Onslow's Board of Directors, at the March 24 scheduled board meeting, made the difficult decision to cancel this year's Annual Meeting of Members.

Last month it was announced that the March 27 annual meeting would be postponed. The directors reviewed the latest recommendations from federal and state agencies and, in the best interest of everyone involved, made the determination to cancel this year's event.

"The board considered the risk to our employees and members," said Chairman John Pierce, "and decided it was best to err on the side of caution and follow the guidelines for social distancing as well as the recommendation of limiting large gatherings. We hope the precautions we've taken will help our community in the coming weeks."

"We look forward to the 2021 annual meeting," Pierce continued. "Folks that attend the meeting have a great time and it's truly a wonderful event that lets us brings our members and community together."



Jones-Onslow EMC has activated its Business Continuity Plan and will continue to examine our daily operations to ensure the safety of employees and members. As your local energy provider, we are determined to continue delivering the reliable power that you have become accustomed to while helping protect the health and well-being of our community.

In response to growing concerns surrounding the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19), we have taken the following proactive steps in the way we conduct daily business:

- On March 12, we announced that this year's Annual Meeting of Members had been postponed. At the March 24 board meeting, your Board of Directors reviewed the most up-todate recommendations from federal and state agencies to determine the best next steps for the 2020 Annual Meeting (see **2020 Annual Meeting Update** on page one for more).
- On March 14, we suspended the disconnection of electric service for members due to non-payment until April 15, 2020. We have also waived late payment fees during this time to help with the economic impact on our members. PLEASE REMEMBER, WE ARE NOT WAIVING THE PAYMENT OF ELECTRIC BILLS but allowing members additional time to pay their bill without incurring disconnection or late fees.
- On March 18, JOEMC offices were closed to walk-in traffic until further notice. Our drive-thru windows will remain open, and we will continue to meet your needs over the phone and via email. We encourage all members to conduct JOEMC business over the phone, via our website, at our payment kiosks, or through email.
- In addition to these changes, all employee travel has been canceled until further notice. We are also limiting the interaction of outside vendors, except for the delivery of necessary materials and supplies critical to our operations.
- Some of our employees will work from home, and those who remain at our office will be spread out to minimize risk. Our outside crews and personnel will continue to function as they always do, and we will continue to operate 24/7 for power outages. In the event of a power outage, please report it via our website, text alert program, or call the office at (910) 353-1940.

The safety and well-being of co-op employees and members remain our utmost priority. This is a fluid situation, and as circumstances continue to evolve, please remember that we are committed to being responsive to the community's needs. Maple Bacon Dip

Ingredients:

- 8 ounces cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup mayonnaise
- ½ cup milk
- 8 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled
- 1 package country gravy mix
- 1½ cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese, divided
- ¹/₃ cup chopped red apple
- 2 tablespoons maple syrup

Directions:

- 1) Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2) In large bowl, mix cream cheese, mayonnaise, milk, bacon, gravy mix and 1 cup cheese until well blended.
- 3) Spray 9-inch glass pie plate with nonstick cooking spray. Spread mixture in plate and top with apple and remaining cheese.
- 4) Bake 25 minutes, or until heated through and cheese is melted. Drizzle with syrup.
- 5) Serve with apple slices, toasted bread cubes or crackers.
